#### How many ways can I register?



- Online: https://turbovote.org/ OR http://registertovoteflorida.gov
- You will need to provide your Florida drivers license and the last four digits of your social security number.
- In Person & By Mail: This must be postmarked or handed in at least 29 days before Election Day and send to the Supervisor of Elections Office Once your application is reviewed, you will receive a voter information card in the mail.

#### What is a voter information card?

• The card will have your party affiliation, assigned polling location, and local, state, and federal district designation.
