Important Dates

Primary Election: August 14, 2018

Voter Registration Deadline: July 25, 2018 Request for Absentee Ballot: August 10, 2018

General Election: November 6, 2018

Voter Registration: Deadline: October 17, 2018 Request for Absentee Ballot: November 2, 2018



How many ways can I register?



- In Person on Election Day
- By Mail: Registration forms must be printed, signed, and mailed or delivered to your municipal clerk at least 20 days before Election Day
- Online: 20 days before Election Day at https://turbovote.org/ OR at https://myvote.wi.gov/en-US/RegisterToVote

To register online, enter your name, date of birth, drivers license or ID number, and the address that matches the address on your ID

What is Absentee Voting?
