## Important Dates



**Primary Election:** August 28, 2018

Voter Registration Deadline: July 30, 2018

Request for Absentee Ballot: August 22, 2018

**General Election:** November 6, 2018

Voter Registration Deadline: October 9, 2018

Request for Absentee Ballot: October 30, 2018

## How many ways can I register?



- **Online:** <https://turbovote.org/> OR <http://registertovoteflorida.gov>
- You will need to provide your Florida drivers license and the last four digits of your social security number.
- **In Person & By Mail:** This must be postmarked or handed in at least 29 days before Election Day and send to the Supervisor of Elections Office. Once your application is reviewed, you will receive a voter information card in the mail.

## What is a voter information card?

- The card will have your party affiliation, assigned polling location, and local, state, and federal district designation.

## What is Absentee Voting/ Voting by Mail?

- This allows you to vote by mail if you cannot vote in person on election day.
- You can request a vote-by mail ballot online or by contacting your Supervisor of Elections in writing by email, in person, or by telephone call.
- You do not need an excuse to request this ballot.
