Important Dates

Primary Election: August 14, 2018

Voter Registration Deadline: July 25, 2018

Request for Absentee Ballot: August 10, 2018

General Election: November 6, 2018

Voter Registration: Deadline: October 17, 2018

Request for Absentee Ballot: November 2, 2018

How many ways can I register?



- In Person on Election Day
- By Mail: Registration forms must be printed, signed, and mailed or delivered to your municipal clerk at least 20 days before Election Day
- Online: 20 days before Election Day at <https://turbovote.org/>
OR at <https://myvote.wi.gov/en-US/RegisterToVote>

To register online, enter your name, date of birth, drivers license or ID number, and the address that matches the address on your ID

What is Absentee Voting?

- This allows you to vote by mail or vote early in person. You must fill out an application for a ballot and send it to your municipal clerk office.
- You do not need an excuse to request an absentee ballot .

Registering on Election Day? You can either:

- Bring your valid Wisconsin Driver's License/ ID Card with your current Wisconsin address

OR

- a photo ID (such as a university/college photo ID) AND proof of residence (such as university bank statement or utility bill)
