Important Dates

General Election: November 6, 2018

Voter Registration Deadline: October 9, 2018

Request for Absentee Ballot: October 27, 2018

How many ways can I pre-register?



- **In Person:** Visit your local county or city clerk's office, the Secretary of State, or a participating state agency to obtain and fill out an application.
- You will need to provide your Michigan driver's license or state ID number, or the last four digits of your SSN.
- **By Mail:** This must be postmarked 30 days before the election and sent to your city or township clerk

What is a voter registration card?

- The card will have your name and assigned polling location on it.
- Your voter registration card is for your personal reference and not required to vote.
- If you do not receive or lose your card, contact your local clerk for a replacement or visit the Michigan Voter Information Center.

What is Absentee Voting/ Voting by Mail?

- This allows you to vote by mail if you cannot vote in person on election day.
- You can download the form and mail to your local city or county clerk.

First time Voting in Michigan?

You must vote in person during your first election unless you hand-delivered your voter registration application.

What to bring:

If you don't have ID, don't worry! You can sign an affidavit and still cast a ballot.
- Your ballot will be counted on Election Day!

- Additionally, Michigan law requires all voters to show photo ID at the polls.
- EX: Driver's license, state ID, U.S. passport, student ID, etc.
