Important Dates

- General Election: November 6, 2018
- Voter Registration Deadline: October 16, 2018
- Request for Absentee Ballot: October 5, 2018
- Early Voting: September 21-November 5, 2018

How many ways can I pre-register?



- **Online:** <https://turbovote.org/> OR <https://mnvotes.sos.state.mn.us/VoterRegistration/VoterRegistrationMain.aspx>
- You will need to provide your Minnesota driver's license or state ID number.
- If you don't have an ID, you can provide the last four digits of your SSN instead!
- **In Person & By Mail:** This must be sent and received by your local Board of Elections or the Secretary of State's Office at least 21 days before the election.

Can I do same day registration on Election Day?

- In Minnesota, you can register and vote on Election Day!
- At the polling place, you must prove both who you are and where you live. The best way to do this is with your valid government issued ID with your current address printed on it.
